Core Knowledge (Need to know)	Vocabulary
Prior knowledge -  There are different size houses.  You get different styles of house.  People's homes are in all different locations.	Home - A building/structure that a person/group of people might live in.
<ul> <li>Homes have changed over time and look very different now to how they may have looked a long time ago.</li> <li>Different materials have been used to build homes.</li> <li>We can use the word 'modern' to describe a house that was built more recently.</li> <li>Britain has many old houses, as well as houses only a few days old. If you walk down a street in a town or city you could walk past Victorian, Tudor, Georgian and modern houses, all mixed together. But how can you tell when they were built?</li> <li>We can look at things inside a house to investigate how homes have changed over time.</li> </ul>	Flat - A large building that is split into smaller homes.  Semi-detached house - Two houses that are joined in the middle so they share a wall.  Terraced house - A row of three or more houses all joined together. They usually have their own back gardens but don't always have a driveway.
<ul> <li>Good to Know</li> <li>There are different types of houses found in Smarden.</li> <li>In many parts of the world, houses are made from mud and clay instead of bricks.</li> <li>Some cities around the world are very crowded and houses are squashed together.</li> <li>Sometimes more than one family might live in the same home.</li> <li>Homes around the world are different depending on where they are.</li> </ul>	Detached house - A house that stands on its own. It may have a driveway and a back garden. It might have a front garden too.  Bungalow - A house that is all on one level so it does not have any stairs.
